A LARGE, and general assortment of European and East India goods, suitable to the season; among which are... jeans-cotton denims-corduroys-velvet- yard wide flowered petticoating-Irish linens- white and brown Irish sheeting- Holland beds and pillows- mattresses- striped and plain lustrings-China taffeta-black and white satins- Persian taffeta-silk Persian and sattin petticoats- fine patent aprons-silk gauze-blond and thread lace- head flowers-ear-rings and hair pins-black and white silk handkerchiefs and cravats-Womens and childrens fashionable silk bonnets-cane and straw hats-silk cloaks- mens and boys fashionable beaver hats-ladies riding beaver [hats]- mens, womens, and girls gloves and mitts-womens silk [mitts]- printed calicoes- white leather shoes-mens belt shoes- violins-string for violins- almonds-sun-raisins, and currants in jarre-sugar-candy-Spanish juice-painter's colours of all sorts- basket salt-double and single refined loaf sugar-sail cloth...
