

<u>The Hook</u> The Distribution of Slaves: 1820

Thomas Jefferson was the "architect" of several of the Northwest Ordinances; plans to control the sale and population of newly acquired lands following the Revolutionary War. Despite being a slave owner himself, he called for the new lands to be free of slave labor. By 1820, after his own presidency, the United States had grown and struggled with the slave issue. The map depicts the condition of the slave populations at that time.
