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Determining Whether a Statement is a Policy or a Procedure

Policies:

- Guiding principles that express the institutional culture, goals, and philosophy.
- Policies promote consistence and operational efficiency, enhance the University's mission and mitigate significant institutional risk.
- May be required by USM Board of Regents Policy, Federal, or State regulations.
- Approved through shared governance and the President. Maintained on the UMBC Policy page.

Procedures:

- May be referenced or required in USM BOR or UMBC Policies as 'policies and procedures'.
- Step-by-step descriptions of the tasks required to support and carry out organizational policies.
- Procedures articulate the process for accomplishing controls.
- Outlines specific restrictions and exclusions.
- Approval is made within departmental/area leadership. Policies and procedures with a broad impact should be socialized to the extent reasonable, but shared governance approval is not required.

Policies	Procedures
Have widespread application	Have a narrower focus
Are non-negotiable, change	Are subject to change and continuous
infrequently	improvement
Are expressed in broad terms	Are a more detailed description of activities
Are statements of what and/or why	Are statements of how, when and/or who & sometimes what
Answer major operational issues	Detail a process
